At the request of Counsel, Camp Al Taqaddum, the camera was not sent to NCISFO Bahrain Evidence Repository immediately. On 17Aug04, granted permission for the search of the camera. During the search, three images of and one image of were discovered. The images depict both and and aiming weapons at were discovered. The aiming weapons at On 31Aug04, the camera was forwarded to the NCISFO Bahrain Evidence Repository via Registered Mail number RA 044 140 505 US. Exhibit (8)
- 11. On 17Aug04, was requested to grant permission for a search of his person and property; however, declined to grant permission... make the following free and voluntary statement to Special Agent whom I know to be a Representative of the United States Naval Criminal Investigative Service. I make this statement of my own free will and without any threats made to me or promises extended. I fully understand that this statement is given concerning my knowledge of suspected detainee abuse. For identification purposes, I am a male standing about niches tall and weighing about pounds. I have hair and eyes. I was born on the standard of the standar my social security number is I am assigned to Naval Medical Center Balboa, San Diego, CA, but I am currently attached to 1st Medical Battalion, 1st Force Service Support Group, Camp Al-Qaim, Iraq. My knowledge of this incident began around the second week of Jul04, here at Camp Al-Qaim. On that occasion, we were receiving an Iraqi citizen who was disembarking a UH-60 (Blackhawk) helicopter on a medical litter sometime around dusk to early evening. While receiving that patient, I observed USMC, with a camera in his hand. It appeared as though he was going to take a picture of the patient as he was preparing his camera at the time. I'm not too sure but I duty was to be a litter-bearer and assist with taking the patient from the helicopter. As the patient was being search is when I observed actions. I approached and instructed him to put the camera away and explained to him that it was not appropriate to take pictures of the detainee patients. I believed the situation to have been taken care of and didn't think anything else of the matter. About a week later at night, I was in the treatment tent and observed with a video camera filming some of the detainee patients we had at the time. I approached began to verbally counsel him for his videotaping and that he should not, again, take any pictures of the detainees. I instructed him to erase the images that he had just taped and I stood there while watching him erase it. He did this by recording over the images while he aimed the camera at the walls and floors of the tent. As I counseled I had USMC. standing there with me. I informed the two that the next time this occurred it would result in a "charge-sheet". The next day, we had our normal formation and I took the opportunity to remind everyone that there is not to be any photo taking of the detainee patients for any reason. In the past, we have been informed that we could take photographs of the U.S. military patients who wish to have photographic documentation of their injuries and we could photograph patients to assist with identification of those who had none. I didn't want there to be any confusion and I made sure to inform the personnel that there is not to be any photograph taking of any detainee. Due to different duty assignments, I cannot say for sure that USMC, was in the formation or not, but I made sure was in the formation. I know he was because I specifically remember him breaking eye contact and looking towards the deck as I looked at him during my lecture.

200	observed me counseling about the video camera the night before and we discussed the information to be passed before the formation began. supported me with this matter because we know the seriousness of these circumstances.
	Around 2130-2200, 09Aug04, we received an Iraqi citizen patient who I do not know the identity because we rarely have the identification of the Iraqi patients. He had a lower back injury that was suspected to be shrapnel but turned out to be a bullet wound. During treatment, has the duty of being the primary guard. Once they are recovering, we move into a "watch bill". We wanted to give security a real high priority because we understood that particular patient as being injured by counter-battery fire due to him allegedly firing mortars in a local surrounding area. It was determined a couple of days later that he was actually shot by somebody.
	During his recovery, and were assigned the guard duties for that patient. Sometime within a few minutes after 2300, 09Aug04, I was at my desk when one of our doctors. USN, approached me and whispered to me something to the effect of, I think some of your Marines are taking pictures in the other tent". I immediately got up and walked over to the tent at which time I observed a flash of light, that appeared to be a camera flash, shine through the small openings of the tent. I immediately entered the tent and approached I approached him because of the consistent problems I've had with him and cameras. I began to counsel him. He immediately looked down towards a medical supply (AMMAL) can and I looked in the same direction. I observed a camera in the AMMAL, which was on. As soon as hoticed that I seen the camera, he reached down and picked it up. At that time, I seized the camera from him. Although I did not asked his permission, I believed he would have deleted any pictures he had taken if he had the chance. I believed that due to his past track record of taking pictures and my informing him that he was going to get a "charge sheet" the next time he took pictures of a detainee. I knew that if there were any incriminating pictures on the camera, I had to protect them so he could not delete them. Although I was standing in front of I began to look around the room and made eye contact with the others present to include them with the counseling. Also present was JSN, and USN. I then exited the tent with the camera. At one point in time, I remember tent but I do not recall if he entered at the time I did or, the time I was counseling the group.
	After exiting the tent, I stood there for a moment to calm down and then went to my to inform him that we need to do a charge sheet. I instructed him to go get witness statement from which were to be used against light. I gained familiarity with camera the next morning and was able to review the recorded images. There were four images on the camera from inside the tent from the previous night. One of them had holding his M-16 service rifle from his hip and aimed in the direction of the detainee patient. In that image, was holding his other hand up and had his fingers configured to where he was giving "the bird" gesture. The other two images were similar in that was standing next to the detainee patient again gesturing "the bird". The fourth image was with tanding next to the detainee patient with his M-16 service rifle aimed at his head with the flash suppresser about 3 feet away from his head. 
who appeared to be applying gauze bandages to the patient. Per his word, the other corpsman, was out of view of the camera but administering care and focused on other areas of medical treatment.
After viewing the images, I realized that the situation was much bigger and that would, also, be included in the "charge sheet". Initially, I was going to request charges for dereliction of duty and disobeying an order but it has, obviously, grown much larger.
do not recall if the patient was awake while I was in the tent and the images on the camera were too small for me to notice his eyes but his face is plainly on the images. I did not download any images from the camera and maintained it in my custody until I released it to USMC, CSSG-15, who escorted and back to Camp Al-Taqaddum, IZ. I maintained a chain of custody and had sign for the camera on 11Aug04. While in my custody, the camera was in my cargo pocket unless I was in my living quarters, which has no identify markings. While in my living quarters, I was there, as well, and it was locked in my wall locker. Heavy of the camera of the patient was aware of the photographs being taken but I do know that he had strong doses of morphine as a result of his injuries. To the best of my knowledge, the patient was transferred out that night as a mater of routine.

I was born on good, on and my social security number is I am assigned to 1st Medical Battalion, 1st Force Service Support Group, Camp Al-Qaim, IZ Tam a Corpsman assigned to the Shock Trauma Platoon-4, Camp Al-Qaim, IZ. Around 2230, on the night of 09Aug04, I was performing duties as a litter bearer when we received a wounded Iraqi citizen. We set the litter and patient on the ground in front of the vehicle headlights so, he could be searched before we carried him into the resuscitation/treatment tent. Once we carried him into the tent, the doctors began to evaluate his injuries and determined that the patient needed to go to an Alpha Surgical Company for X-Rays and surgery. The doctors put bandages on the patient. I was assigned to stay with the patient from 2300-2400 and get him prepared for a medivac flight to Al-Asad IZ. was assigned the watch after mine if the patient did not get medivac'd out by the end of was supposed to be the Corpsman to fly with the patient so, he stayed to assist me with my duties. The two of us believed the medivac was going to occur soon so, we immediately began to prepare the patient. I believe were assigned duties as security over the patient. At one point in time, I remember was attempting to get the last set of vital signs for the patient the "pro-paq" had been shut down. I remember what the vital signs were so, I walked over and provided them to him. As the patient lay on his back on the litter with his head pointing towards the main tent door and his feet towards the opposing end, standing to the right hand side of the patient's feet. I was standing to at the end of the litter at the patient's feet. I then returned to preparing the patient for the flight. Part of that preparation involved the need to use the litter straps to secure the patient to the liter. 





Since my arrival in Iraq, I've posed for two photographs wherein I have a weapon drawn. The first time I have ever done this was sometime around Jun04. We had received four wounded Marines and an Enemy Prisoner of War (EPW). They were wounded from a grenade blast because an Iraqi had thrown a grenade and one of the Marines, USMC, had jump on top of the grenade while throwing his Kevlar helmet over top of the grenade. I was videotaping the Marines and one of our doctors had come up to me and said something to the effect of, "hey, cut the video... he's dying". After hearing that, I stopped taping. Was not upset at me for taping but rather upset that the Marine was dying. I believe anyone should be able to hear on my video because I was still taping at the time he told me that. That recording, along with other photographs of Marines posing with their weapons, should be stored on my external hard-drive for my compute

About two hours before the incident I have just explained, I had posed for a photograph with one of the EPW's that had been brought in with the four Marines. After talking with Special Agent. I understand the problems that these kind actions can cause but I don't understand why and I are getting in trouble. I know may have violated an order if he was told not to take any more photographs but people need to understand that taking these kind of photographs are very common at the STP and it is excepted by everyone. As an example, I was taking a videotape of a couple of 7-ton trucks loaded with EPW's. I remember telling me something like, "I don't think you should be taping that because they might not like it". After the convoy left, USMC, told me, "Well, now that you got away with it, I would like a copy". Anyone should be able to hear the conversation on the video because the camera was still recording. About ten minutes later, I was in my living tent and came up to me and gave me his thumb drive. I copied the video for him and gave it back to him.

If would like to apologize for my actions and say that I will never do anything like that again nor, will I allow myself to be put in a position for that to happen. I just wish I used a little more common sense at the time. I just got caught up in circumstances where I thought it was accepted because I didn't mean any harm. A Condition 4 weapons has no magazine inserted, the bolt forward on an empty chamber, ejection port cover closed, and the weapon on safe. I did not receive any written or formal training on how EPWs are supposed to be handled and watched. Prior to getting to Iraq, Staught a class on searching an EPW. The class included muzzle awareness of the Marine covering the EPW, how to search an EPW's clothing, and how to restrain and EPW if needed. The class lasted about fifteen minutes.




